Additional Federal Funding for Home and Community Based Services

The North Dakota Legislature, in the recent special session, has given approval for DHS to spend an additional \$31.6 million dollars on home and community based services from federal ARPA funding.

The department has proposed to spend this money on increasing capacity of the HCBS system, supporting transitions from the Life Skills Transition Center, and piloting services to address gaps.

What's Happening Elsewhere re Olmstead?

In Minnesota, the Olmstead Implementation Office created the Olmstead Leadership Forum, a stakeholder input group with the public and representatives of Minnesota's agencies gathering to discuss work to modify the Plan to improve progress. North Carolina has released a draft Olmstead Plan, after an 18-month stakeholder input and drafting process led by the Olmstead Plan Stakeholder Advisory and the Technical Assistance Collaborative (TAC), the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services.
